

### Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council was chaired by Alan Glister. In his Chairman's report, Mr Glister noted that it had been another busy year for the Parish Council. The Parish Council, he noted, has moved forward in facing new challenges and has engaged in these on behalf of the majority of the people who live in the village.

The Parish Council continues to support the local community with grants to the Village Hall, the church, the Bowls Club, the Pre School and the Playing Field Committee. It is also spending £10,000 on adult exercise equipment at the play area on the Water Meadows and has recently funded publication of a village history.

The Parish Precept, he noted, has been cut from £38,000 to £30,000 for the new financial year, but the Council continues to give financial support to the majority of village organisations for the benefit of the village's inhabitants.

The meeting also heard annual reports from County Councillor John Gretton, who noted that it had been a privilege and pleasure to serve the parish and Ken Steward, Chairman of the Playing Field Committee, who noted that the new pavilion was in the course of construction.

Mrs Yvonne Long noted that the Village Hall continues to be used for a wide range of purposes from yoga classes to meetings of the Women's Institute and the Parish Council, birthday parties and other functions. The Trustees of the Village Hall are to tarmac and lower the kerb outside the front of the building.

A report on behalf of the Church noted the church continues to provide a weekly service, as well as the Flower Festival and Christmas Fair. The church is to apply for a grant from English Heritage to cover part of the cost of maintaining the building, which is estimated at £120,000.

In his report, Mr Graham Chambers, the school's headmaster, noted that the school had won a local area cricket competition and played in the seven a side competition at Carrow Road. The school is developing links with the rural life museum at Gressenhall, reflecting the agricultural nature of the parish and with the Arts College in Norwich. Mr Chambers expressed his thanks to the School Trust for its continued support.
