Community Car Scheme

A new community car scheme has been proposed for Scarning. The parish is currently served by Transport Plus, which is part funded by Norfolk County Council. A proposal has been put to the Parish Council to use a more local scheme. The costs under the proposed new scheme would be divided between the customer, Breckland Council and Scarning Parish council. For a return journey totalling 40 miles, for instance, the customer would pay £8, All journeys under the proposed new scheme would be health related only and would not include shopping trips. Should a patient be accompanied by a friend, there is the same charge for them. An escort can accompany patients

who need such assistance without charge. Should an appointment take longer than two hours, an extra payment would be charged, For local calls, it is proposed that a set fee of between £2 and £3 would be levied.

Similar schemes currently operate in about twenty towns and villages in Breckland. The Parish Council would like to gauge the reaction of parishioners to the proposal.
