Grant Awards

The Parish Council is pleased to announce that this year it has made grants to Seaming School and Scaming Pre school. The school has been awarded £1,500 to create a wildlife pond for the school and the community. The pre school has been awarded £2,000 towards improvements within the pre school building.

Christmas is coming

Christmas is coming and as part of this year's celebrations the Parish Council is to purchase two Christmas trees for the village. One will be put outside the school, the second outside the church. It is planned to hold a Christmas Tree Fair in the church next year.

Water Meadows

The Parish Council, in conjunction with Wensum Valley Trust, is hoping to become responsible for a greater area of the Water Meadows. The large playing field on the meadows is currently leased by the Parish Council, as is the smaller play area. The Parish Council hopes to take over responsibility for the pond at Blackthorn Drive, as well as land near Ted Ellis Walk. The Council will also manage the grassy area between the stream and Draytonhall Lane housing estate.

Breckland Council will continue to be responsible for maintaining the bridges, fences, paths, hedges and trees. The Parish Council intends to improve the area and to encourage wildlife. Work has already begun near Ted Ellis Walk, where willow trees have been cut back or removed, and a number of scrapes - or series of small shallow pools - have been created.

The Parish Council has also agreed to clear the pond at Blackthorn Drive, work on which should commence shortly. It is planned to eventually put up boardwalks in certain areas of the meadows together with information boards about the flora and fauna that can be seen. Most of the work will continue to be carried out by a dedicated team of volunteers and the more volunteers there are the quicker the site can be restored to its former glory.

Scarning Water Meadows is a beautiful area and if you are able to give a few hours here and there towards its maintenance it will help to preserve this valuable piece of the village for future generations. Bag it, Tie it and Bin it

The Parish Council is spearheading a campaign to improve the use of dog bins in the village. A series of posters are being displayed on notice boards throughout the village urging those who do not already do so to use the bins provided for their dog waste.

The Council, in conjunction with Breckland Council, has also been distributing leaflets informing residents that dog waste from their homes can be deposited into their green household waste bins. This is to ensure that the dog bins in the village are used only by those out walking their dogs and not from any excess, which otherwise means the bins fill too quickly. There are currently ten dog bins in the village, four of which are on the Water Meadows. The cooperation of all residents would be greatly appreciated in tackling this issue.
